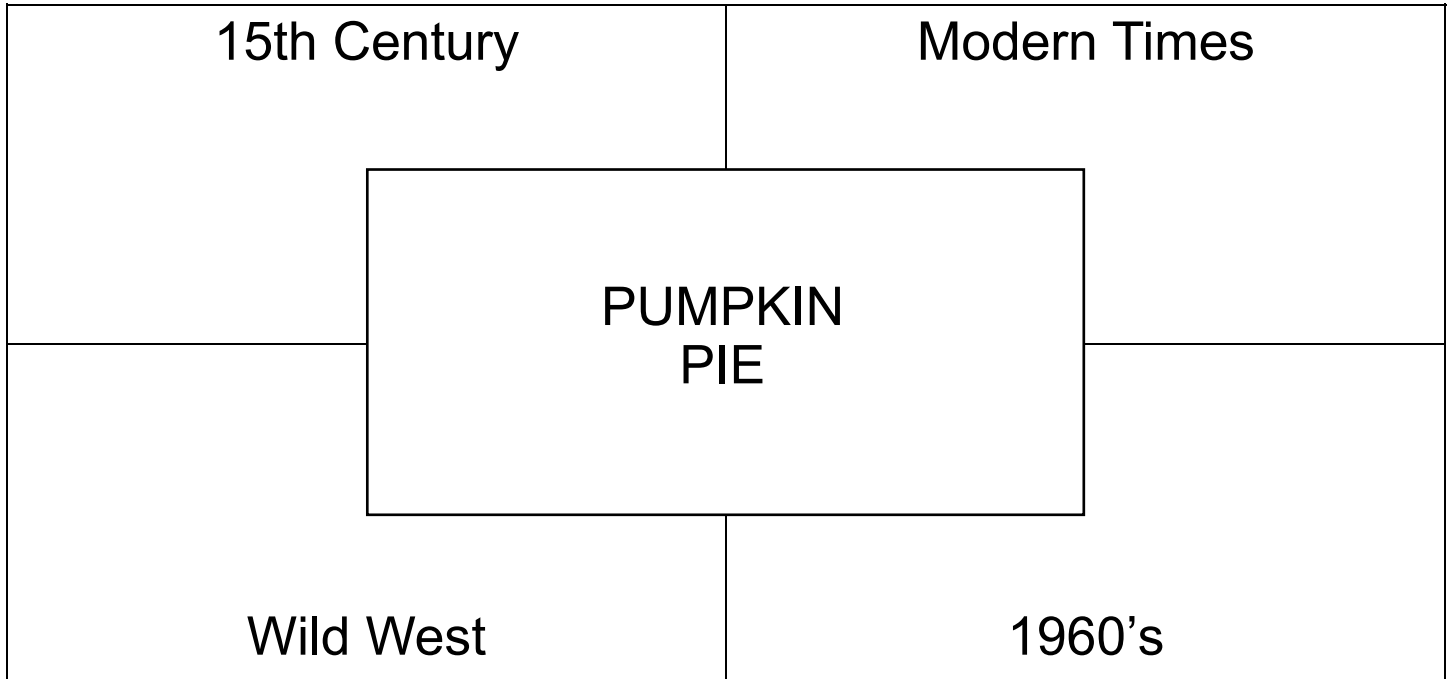

## EXAMPLE 1



In this example, "pumpkin pie" is the key word so, each story should be about pumpkin pie.

Was pumpkin pie even invented yet in the 15th Century? How hard was it to make?

In Modern Times, people may wish to write about why they do or don't like it....or even give their family's favorite recipe for it!

For Wild West: Did Native Americans know what it was? Was it offered to those coming out west or was it strictly an Eastern thing....or vice versa, maybe it was only available in the west and that's why those in the east started moving west!

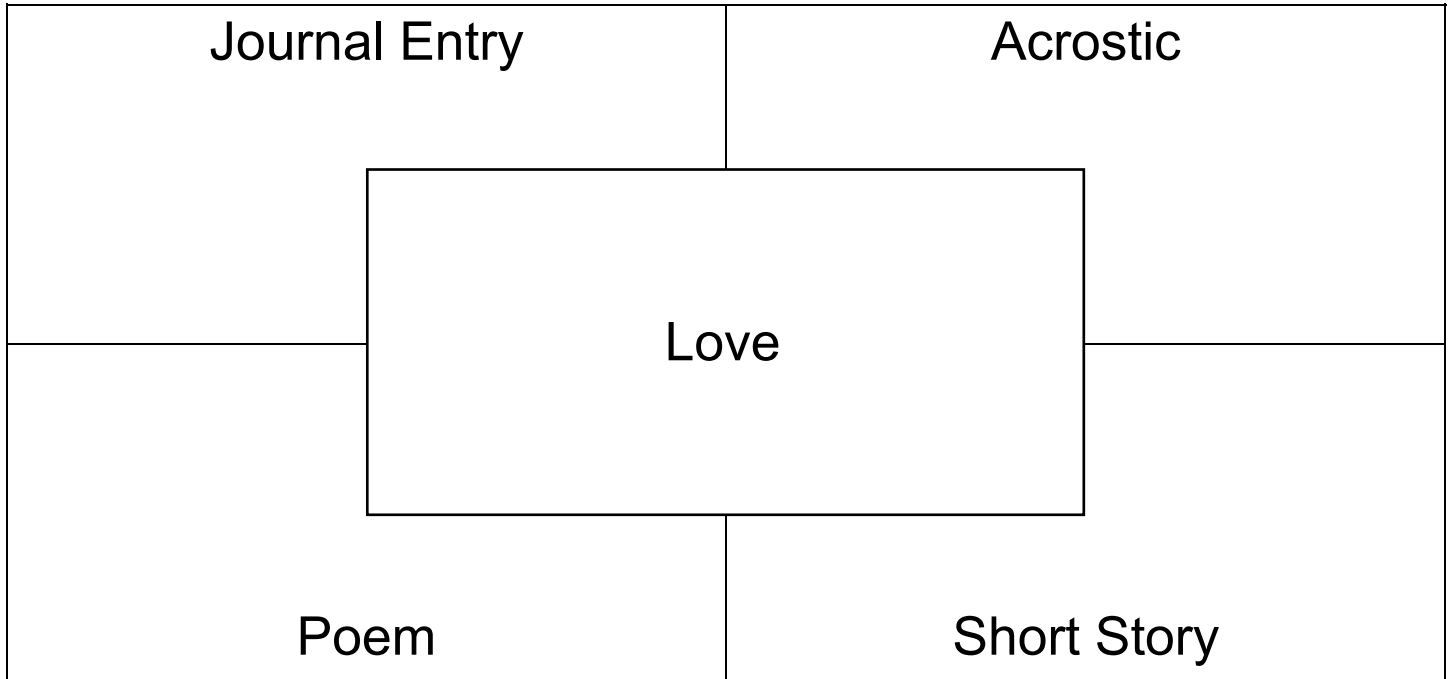
For 1960's, how was it commonly served (it's tradition now to top it with cool whip, but maybe our parents or grandparents preferred it with ice cream - or ate it plain - back in the 60's).

The stories only have to make sense! Maybe the writings are true about that specific time period...maybe it's a complete work of fiction. Bonus points for those who make a convincing argument that it DID really happen that way if it's a fictional piece!

## EXAMPLE 2



In this example, “love” is the key word so, each of the four prompts should be about love *and* in the format given.

A journal entry - about the person the writer loves most, a toy, a favorite song the person loves, etc.

Acrostic - Use a the word itself or a person, place or thing that is loved.
